Scranton Preparatory School is happy to announce that through EANS grant funds it is currently accepting applications for qualified applicants for the 2022-2023 school year to provide one-on-one and small group tutoring that would serve as a supplemental drop-in resource outside of Prep faculty office hours. Tutors will work weekday shifts - before school, during lunch periods, or in the afternoon - based on tutor availability. Tutors will be paid based on hours served, at a rate of \$34/hour. Tutors would report to the department chair for that subject.

The ideal candidate will meet the following minimum requirements:

- Evidence of experience and expertise in subject area;
- Previous high school teaching/tutoring experience preferred;
- Knowledge of and ability to articulate learning strategies and study skills for the specific subject;
- Possesses a genuine enthusiasm for and interest in working with high school students;
- Has a willingness to animate the Catholic and Jesuit mission of the school and its philosophy and values;
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
